2010: There have been challenges and triumphs in the last year. As an affiliate, we achieved a significant milestone to complete the 50-home neighborhood in Snoqualmie called Koinonia Ridge. We also broke ground on a brand new neighborhood called La Fortuna in Renton. In August, four families moved into their new homes in Magnolia Village in the Issaquah Highlands. While Habitat for Humanity of East King County served more families locally than ever before, Habitat for Humanity International topped 400,000 homes built, serving over 2 million people worldwide. Staff and Eastside volunteers also continued to serve the worldwide community by traveling to China, Chile and Nepal in 2010 to lend our skills there. Even as the economy struggled and everyone across the country and around the world dug in and buckled down, Habitat EKC continued building homes. We are proud of this accomplishment and want to thank you for standing by us and all of the families that we serve. I truly mean it when I say, it could not have been done without you.

Criteria for Selection

- **Housing Need:**

Current conditions are substandard or overcrowded; housing expenses are significantly more than 30% of income

- **Ability to Pay:**

Income does not exceed 60% of area's median income but is sufficient to pay a mortgage, homeowner association dues, and taxes (approximately \$750-\$850 per month)

- **Willingness to Partner:**

Will contribute 500 hours of sweat-equity hours and attend homebuyer workshops, including budgeting, home maintenance, disaster preparedness, and conflict resolution

Why Habitat for Humanity Works

- **Habitat** invests

tremendous time and energy in ensuring its families are successful homeowners.

- **Habitat** engages

thousands of volunteers in the direct production of housing

- **Habitat** empowers

families with stability and growing financial security.

- **Habitat** breaks

the cycle of instability and poverty that accompanies substandard housing

- **Habitat** provides

a permanent and lasting solution to a family's housing crisis.

Habitat for Humanity works to increase the availability of affordable housing opportunities for families living on low incomes. For housing to be considered affordable, a family must spend no more than 30% of their gross income on housing. On average, Habitat homeowners earn \$2,500 - \$2,800 per month, which would make a housing payment of \$750 - \$850 affordable. With rents for two-bedroom apartments averaging \$1,000 per month, the lack of affordable housing puts people in financial jeopardy. It is impossible to escape the cycle of poverty when there is nothing left over on which to build tomorrow.

Each year, hundreds of families turn to Habitat for Humanity in an effort to change their futures.

Throughout the rigorous application and screening process, we require families to provide us with information about their finances and credit history, and submit to a home interview during which we inspect their current living situation. Selected families spend 500 hours building homes, participating in homeowner education classes, meeting and working alongside their house sponsors, and attending community events. They juggle their personal responsibilities—work, school, child care, home life—while constructing the home in which they'll live. Their home is sold to them with a zero-interest loan: their payment set at no more than 30% of their gross monthly income. A chance to change everything.

Domitilla Riziki has just the kind of story that inspires us all. After civil war erupted in her home country of Burundi, Domatilla and her four children escaped to Ghana where they lived in a refugee camp for 6 years.

Finally awarded a refugee visa, the Riziki family was able to immigrate to the United States and was welcomed into the community in East King County.

Domitilla has supported her family with a stable job as a daycare provider for seven years. Since being selected as homeowners in 2009, Domitilla and her three oldest children have all contributed their time and energy to completing their sweat equity.

The family will finally be able to move into their own home in the Issaquah Highlands in late 2011. In the meantime, the children are studying hard at school, so they can give back to the community and this country that has "opened so many doors to us."

Koinonia Ridge, Snoqualmie

In 2010, we completed the 50 single-family home neighborhood Koinonia Ridge, the largest Habitat development in the Northwest region. Weyerhaeuser Real Estate Company, in participation with the City of Snoqualmie, offered 10 acres of partially developed land for construction beginning in 2001. These homes were incorporated into the overall design of over 4,000 homes that were developed in Snoqualmie Ridge by five other major builders. For the first time, construction also included a community center for all of the homeowners to use. Four homes have been resold to new homeowners, eventually totaling 54 families served in this community alone.

La Fortuna, Renton

In June of 2010, the official groundbreaking ceremony was held for our newest neighborhood: La Fortuna in Renton. Members from throughout the community joined us for this special celebration including Don Perrson, Renton City Council, Terry Mark, Deputy Director from the King County Department of Housing Services and Peter Joers, President of Bank of America in Washington State. The neighborhood will be built in phases, with the first phase of 11 townhomes already underway.

Magnolia Village, Issaquah Highlands

Magnolia Village saw the completion of the first four homes in 2010! The dedication was held on August 14, 2010 on a beautiful summer day. While four families moved into their very own home, six more continue to work on their sweat equity. The neighborhood also hosted Women Build with the Seattle Storm and the 2nd Annual Build-a-Thon! Magnolia Village is expected to be completed in 2012.

2nd Annual Build-a-Thon

The 2nd Annual Build-a-Thon took place in Issaquah from September 17-26, 2010. More than 250 volunteers, Habitat homeowners, businesses and other community members came out to participate in this energizing event. Volunteers put the final touches on the first four homes in the community, and began framing the next two buildings and managed to raise over \$40,000 for affordable housing! Breakfast, lunch, snacks and coffee were donated by partners from all over the community. The event was sponsored by Umpqua Bank, City Forge, Microsoft, Expedia, Genie Industries, Harris Private Bank, Brighton Jones, Columbia Bank and Sierra Systems.

Green Building Program

Our efforts to build sustainable and affordable homes reached new heights in 2010 with the 4-star certification of four homes in Issaquah Highlands under the Master Builder Association's Built Green program. In 2010, we certified five homes under the Built Green and Northwest Energy Star standards. Since 2009, ten of our homes met Energy Star standards and 13 homes were certified under Built Green. Habitat EKC will continue to build homes that achieve 4-star Built Green and Northwest Energy Star certification.



A Brush with Kindness

In 2010, Habitat EKC implemented a new element of our affordable homebuilding program called A Brush with Kindness. Two Habitat EKC homeowners were selected to participate in this pilot program. Selection criteria remain the same: need, ability to pay and willingness to partner. Homeowners and volunteers worked side by side to repair one homeowner's roof and paint another's entire home exterior. Homeowners are extended an interest-free loan to pay for materials that they pay back over a specified time period.

A Brush with Kindness is a Habitat International program that is locally operated, serving low-income homeowners who struggle to maintain the exterior of their homes. The program is a holistic approach to providing affordable housing and assisting communities as well as families.

A Brush with Kindness ensures that families live in safe and well-maintained homes. The program is designed to revitalize the appearance of the neighborhood, encourage connections within the community, and most importantly, help preserve affordable housing stock.

Tasks include painting, minor exterior repairs, landscaping, weatherization and exterior clean-up.

In the future, Habitat EKC will be selecting new families to be a part of this program. Families will be selected based on need, ability to pay and willingness to partner.

In addition to volunteers, Habitat strives to use donated materials and takes no profit for their services.

Payments made by the homeowners are placed in a revolving fund to help A Brush with Kindness serve others in need.

CHINA, March 2010. Mia Walterson, Finance Director, and Emily Fortman, Director of Family Services, led 11 volunteers (including Mike Hammerquist, Construction Supervisor) on a Global Village trip to Ganhaizi Village in southwest China. Along with several villagers, the team spent a week digging a foundation for a modest brick home that would provide adequate housing to an extended Chinese family. After working several long days, the team was honored with singing by the villagers in their local chapel.

CHILE, November 2010. Emily Fortman, Director of Family Services, led 12 volunteers (including Doug Copley, Construction Supervisor, and Kristina Struve, Assistant Site Supervisor) on a Global Village trip to Santiago, Chile. The team spent a week rehabilitating two dilapidated homes as part of the "Our Children Go Home" project, which repairs homes for families with disabled members whose conditions are worsened by substandard living conditions. On the final day of the trip, the team was honored with a traditional Chilean lunch, prepared by the Partner Families.

NEPAL, October 2010. Tom Granger, Executive Director led 6 volunteers, including Board and Advisory Board Members, Dan DeYoung and Dave Thompson in the Everest Build in Pokhara, Nepal. The EKC affiliate volunteers joined more than 450 other volunteers from around the world to build 40 bamboo houses in six days. During the build, volunteers installed bamboo wall panels, plastered them on the outside and inside and then painted the outer walls. One family served was Som Maya Lamichanne, an 83 year old widow, who before the build had been sleeping at nights in her son's home. Now she has her own home thanks to the help of these generous volunteers.

Homeowner Education and Financial Literacy Program

An important part of the Habitat experience for new homeowners is participation in the Homeowner Education and Financial Literacy Program. All new homeowners are required to take part in these classes that teach about topics such as Financial Literacy, Budgeting, Working with an HOA and Conflict Resolution. Classes are almost exclusively taught by volunteers from the community who generously share their expertise in these fields. The 2010 program was funded through a generous grant from KeyBank.

Habitat EKC partners with Eastside Domestic Violence Program

In 2010, Habitat EKC partnered with Eastside Domestic Violence Program (EDVP) to rehab one of their women and children's shelters. Habitat staff and volunteers spent three months repairing and repainting, replacing the play structure, remodeling the bathroom, improving the communal kitchen and installing a new porch roof so that it no longer leaked into the pantry below. As a result, 10 additional families were served and many more families will be served in the future by having access to a safe and decent place to live in transition from an abusive situation to a new life. The mission of EDVP is to end domestic violence by changing individual, institutional and societal beliefs, attitudes and behaviors that perpetuate it. To achieve this they work with the community to: PROVIDE services in East and North King County for people who have experienced physical, emotional or sexual abuse; PREVENT domestic violence through advocacy, education and support.

In October of 2010 Habitat EKC was honored by EDVP at their annual breakfast for our partnership to renovate their confidential transitional shelter. Emily Fortman, Habitat's Director of Family Services accepted the Volunteer of the Year award on the behalf of Habitat. We are honored to work with such an amazing organization as EDVP.

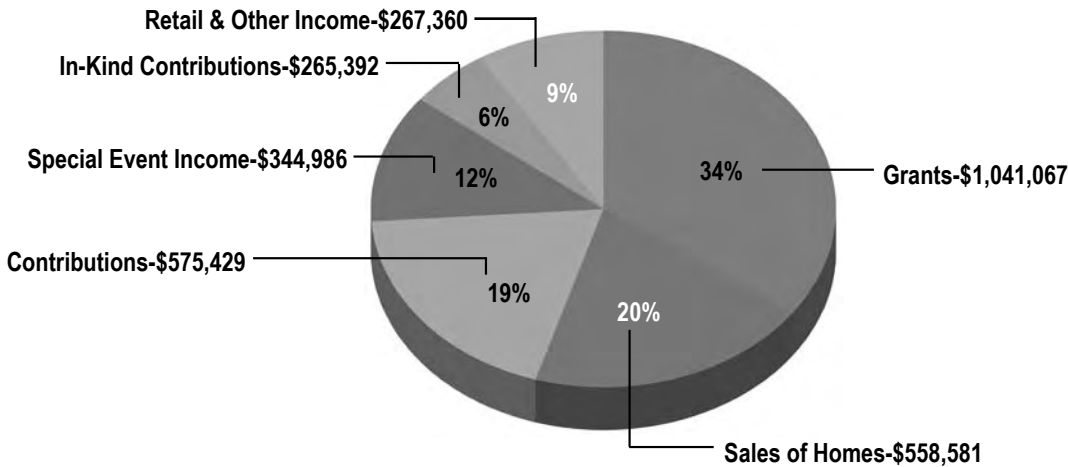

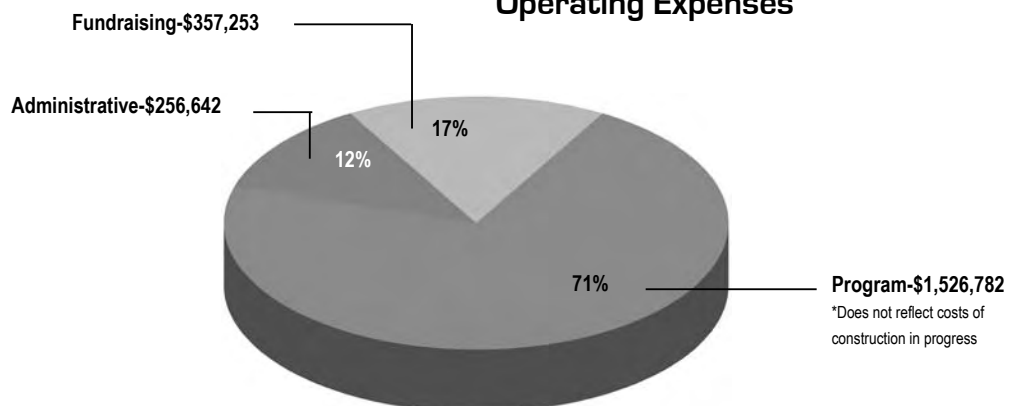
